## How to Lose a Kingdom – 4/26 Talk

- Remind your group to watch the talk from Sunday if they haven't already before your scheduled meeting time!
  - o Did anything from the talk stand out to you this week?
- Read 1 Samuel 9:1-2
  - O What does this passage tell you about Saul?
  - O What do you think others saw in Saul?
  - O What do you think Kish (Saul's father) saw in Saul?
- Read 1 Samuel 9:21-22
  - O What does Saul see in himself?
  - O Why do you think he sees himself this way?
  - O What does Samuel see in Saul?
  - o Have you ever felt insecurity?
    - Is it easy to overcome?
    - Is insecurity always based on truth?
  - Have you ever seen potential in people that they couldn't see in themselves?
  - Has someone ever seen potential in you that you didn't see in yourself?
- Read 1 Samuel 10:8-27
  - o Have you ever had people feed your insecurities?
  - O What is your defense mechanism?
    - Humor, self-deprecation, shutting down, lashing out...
  - o How does this affect you long-term?
- Read 1 Samuel 13:8-14
  - o Have you ever grown impatient with God?

- Do you have more trust in your own ability to lead in your life or in God's?
- How can you know the truth of this answer? (How often do you wait and pray compared to how often you charge ahead with your own decisions?
- Have you ever blamed others or your circumstances for your own bad decisions?
  - What does this reveal?
- Why do you think this ended Saul's anointing to lead as Israel's king?

## • Read 1 Samuel 15:9-30

- o Have you ever felt that you could keep secrets from God?
  - Have you lived as if He didn't know something?
- O Why is confession to God important?
  - Is it because He doesn't know something you've done till you tell Him?
- o Have you ever chosen the popular route over the right one?
  - Why?
  - Looking back, what would you do?

## • Read 1 Samuel 18:6-16

- O What should have more power, what people say or the truth?
  - In reality, do we give more power to what people say sometimes?
  - Why do we do that?
- o Do you ever struggle with jealousy?
  - What about when someone at your work is honored and you don't think they deserve it?
  - What if you know that you have worked harder than them?
- This isn't the only time Saul tries to kill David:
  - 1 Samuel 18:21-27
  - 1 Samuel 19:9-10
  - 1 Samuel 19:11-23
- How do you see Saul lose his kingdom?
  - o Can you struggle in the same ways that Saul did?
  - O What will you do about it?
  - What do your insecurities look like through the lens of the Cross?
