## I Hate to Wait – 5/3 Talk

- Remind your group to watch the talk from Sunday if they haven't already before your scheduled meeting time!
  - o Did anything from the talk stand out to you this week?
- What are your honest emotions when you think about waiting?
  - o Do you consider waiting as a time of preparation?
- Read 1 Samuel 16:14-23
  - o In 1 Samuel 16:13 David is anointed to be the next king.
    - It would be about 15 years before he would become king of part of the kingdom, then 7 more years before becoming king over all of the kingdom of Israel.
  - O Where is David in verse 19?
    - If you were anointed to be king, where do you think you would find yourself waiting?
    - How could waiting in the field have prepared him to be king?
    - How could this waiting have prepared him to battle Goliath?
  - O What was David's role for Saul?
    - Harp player and armor bearer
    - How could these roles prepare him to be king?
      - He would be placed in a setting to become accustomed with the manners of the court, the business of government, and the general state of the kingdom.
    - How would you feel if you were working for the king you would eventually replace?
      - Would these emotions make it more difficult to wait?
- Read 2 Samuel 5:1-5

- David was able to tell them what God had said to him years ago, which means that God was with him while he was waiting and preparing.
  - Knowing that God is with you while you wait, how does that help in times when it seems like He is inactive?
- How can you wait and prepare in this season where it seems that God is sometimes silent or moving slower than we like?
  - Are you waiting well?
